I am very grateful to those of you who responded to my newsletter last week for the helpful comments you have made about things we could do better here at the Academy. I want to use this week's newsletter to respond to some of the issues you raised.

First, some of you commented on arrangements at lunchtime including the risk that children who do not have money on their accounts could go hungry. As all the parents who raised this matter pointed out, the first responsibility does lie with parents to make sure that the students' accounts are kept topped up. However, as a parent myself, I recognise the pressures involved in organising a busy family life and realise that, with the best will in the world, it is possible for a child to find themselves in school without enough money on their account. For this and other reasons we are currently undertaking a detailed review of our lunchtime arrangements and we will send out details of any changes we intend to make very shortly. I hope this will enable us to ensure that lunchtime is a purposeful and wellordered experience for everybody and that, most importantly, nobody goes hungry.

Secondly, a number of you reported that your children had experienced difficulties with their timetables at the start of the school year. For some this meant that they had been placed in the wrong teaching groups and, understandably, this caused some confusion and distress. We recognise that the timetabling process at the start of this year was not as smooth as it should have been, partly because of staffing and technical issues at the end of last term. I am very sorry for any distress that this caused to individual students. We have already taken action to increase the capacity of our timetabling team and I am confident that next year's timetabling process will be smoother. In the meantime however if your son or daughter has any difficulties with their timetable they should speak to the tutor

in the first instance but if the problems persist please do not hesitate to contact me on laura.halsall@winsfordacademy.org.uk.

One or two of you also reported difficulties in getting a response to emails or phone messages that you had sent into the school. Our school office receives and either deals with or passes on many dozens of messages every day. While the overwhelming majority of these receive prompt responses, I am sorry that it is clear that a few have gone astray in the very busy time at the start of term. We will review all our communication systems within school but please do not hesitate to let me know if you have any specific examples of not responding to your concerns quickly enough. Please remember that if you need a reply from a member of our teaching staff, they may very well be teaching and away from emails and phone messages throughout the school day so it may be up to 48 hours before you receive a response.

I said last week that we we're introducing a golden star award system to celebrate those students who demonstrate respectful behaviour throughout a lesson. It has been a real privilege this week to visit many classes and just how focused students have been on their work and how respectfully they have related to their teacher and the rest of the class. Having seen the impact of this reward system this week we are going to extend it next week with more of my senior colleagues visiting more lessons and giving out more rewards. It is really important to me that, even as we deal with the minority of students who do not meet our expectations to be ready, respectful, and safe, we make sure that the great majority who do realise that they are being noticed and recognised for the contribution they make to learning across the Academy.













Reading Homework Challenge.
