#### **Dear Parents and Carers**

My colleagues and I are delighted with how many of our students come to school ready to learn. The response from students to our "stars for chocolate" incentive scheme continues to be excellent, and we will continue running this through until the end of the year, not least because of the dozens of very positive conversations between staff and students that it generates at the end of every school day.

This term we were pleased to welcome back to the Academy the internationally renowned storyteller Jake Evans. Jake has been working not only with our own Year 7 students but also with children from some of our partner primary schools and it has been a real pleasure to have these children join us here in school. Jake's work in the Academy is part of our wider focus on literacy and communication through speaking, listening, reading, and writing. essential skills underpin everything we do across the whole curriculum and out to the absolute heart of literacy is the central role of reading. I'm delighted therefore that we are participating once again in the Cheshire schools reading award. This countywide award scheme is run in partnership between schools and the County Library service. Across the county students will be nominating books that they have read for this award and later in the school year will be voting for the winner. This is a great way of promoting reading and discussing with students the books they have read and enjoyed. Parents have an important part to play in this process. Please do ask students about the books they are reading and what they think of them.

I'm also very pleased to announce that the Academy will be hosting a local event as part of the Diana anti bullying award scheme. This scheme was established in memory of the late Princess of Wales and trains both primary and secondary students to act as antibullying ambassadors in their schools and in their community. Hosting the training events which involve both primary and secondary children and which can draw children from schools across a very

wide area is a real privilege and I am very grateful to Mrs Tringham who has successfully led the application process for us to become a host school. This will be both an important opportunity for our own students to play a key role in supporting others in the Academy and also a chance to showcase the Academy two other schools.

It has been very noticeable how much more smoothly lunch times have gone this half term, while it does not completely eliminate queueing, does reduce waiting time considerably. We have also listened to what students and parents have said about access to the toilets as well as consulting some other schools who have been managing this issue slightly differently. We have introduced a system of lesson passes and have been monitoring access which does seem to be working very well. We will of course keep these arrangements under review.

We received some amazing news this week. We have had colleagues and students shortlisted for multiple awards at the Mid Cheshire Education Awards. The Guardian said "It's a fantastic achievement to be shortlisted for so many awards!"

The Council, alongside Edsential and a range of community partners, are running a wide range of fantastic activities for the Winter Holiday Activities and Food Programme (HAF) that will run throughout the school winter holiday.

The HAF Programme is funded nationally and provides funding for local organisations to provide activities for children and young people during the holidays, helping them to access healthy food and take part in fun activities over the school holidays.

Over the winter there will be a wide range of HAF programmes delivered across the borough by our local partners.

Community interest company, Edsential, is working with 24 organisations, including schools, community, voluntary and faith sector organisations, to organise 32 holiday activity clubs throughout the borough this winter period. The holiday clubs will provide local children and families with the following.

- Good quality healthy meals and snacks, with some family cooking sessions plus food and nutritional education.
- A variety of directly delivered physical activities such as, climbing, swimming, yoga, golf, judo, skateboarding, dance and drama workshops.
- Diverse enrichment activities, including arts and crafts, musical theatre, carol singing, archery, street dance, mindfulness, forest school, trips to Chester Zoo and local Pantos.

#### Youth Zones for 11-16 year olds (up to 25 for our SEND children and young people)

Youth Zones, operated by the Council's Youth Service, will be providing eligible children and young people across the borough with a winter offer.

Youth Zones will be open across the borough and all families of children and young people who are eligible for free school meals will be able to register to attend our winter fun activity programme. All children and young people will be offered a healthy balanced hot meal.

Our winter programme will include a Christmas party, including arts and crafts, games and sports and a trip

#### Provision for children with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND)

A number of organisations have been funded to deliver SEND specific HAF provision across the borough, the varied offer will include sessions for children and young people with an identified need, some sessions will also offer places to their siblings these include ten pin bowling, trampolining, simple cycling and a wide variety of other sessions such as sensory play, festive fun and crafts and disco along with the opportunity to attend the theatre to see a pantomime, food workshops, community cookery, swim sessions and lots lot's more A healthy meal will be provided at every session for the children and young people in attendance.

#### Criteria/eligibility for the programme

This holiday provision is for school aged children from reception to year 11 (inclusive) who are eligible for benefits-related free school meals.

Benefits-related free school meals (FSM) are available to pupils if their parents are in receipt of one of the qualifying benefits, and have a claim verified by their school or local authority. <u>Further information on eligibility for free school meals</u>

#### Household Support Fund payments for children in receipt of Free School Meals (FSM)

Payments for households in receipt of FSM will be made to schools week commencing 5 December. Each eligible family will receive £20 per week, per child, so in total £40 per pupil for the two-week Winter holiday period.



#### **Check your balance**

No longer do you need to queue at a device in the school to check whether you have enough funds remaining to order that meal you've been thinking about; you can now check your balance at home or at any time of day.

#### Order your food in advance

Obviously, the most important part of a pre-order service is the ability to order food in advance, and you can do precisely that.

Show your unique order number and our canteen staff will have your food ready and waiting for you to collect, no queues, no hassle!

#### View your upcoming meal selections

If you've placed multiple pre-orders, it's easy to check what you've ordered from within the app. We'll show you all your meal choices along with your unique order number, so that when it's time to collect your food all you need to do is turn up and show your order number.

#### Recipe of the Week - Lazy Vegetarian Lasagne

Our year 8 students have been making lazy vegetarian lasagne in their Food studies lessons

### Ingredients

1 onion

1 clove garlic

1 carrot

1 courgette

½ pepper

100g mushrooms

1 tsp dried herbs

1 vegetable stock cube

1 egg

6 sheets lasagne

150ml natural yogurt

150ml skimmed milk

50g hard cheese

500ml passata



Wash your hands and get the ingredients and equipment ready.

Turn on oven to gas mark 4/180°C

Peel and chop the onion and peel and crush the garlic
Put the onion and garlic in a saucepan and `dry fry` for 1-2 minutes
Add the grated carrot, grated courgette, pepper and mushrooms to the pan with the
stock cube and the passata.

Cook until the vegetables are tender then add the herbs.

Layer the vegetables in the sauce between the lasagne sheets into an oven proof dish.

In a measuring jug, mix together the egg, yoghurt, milk and half the grated cheese.

Pour the mixture over the top of the lasagne. Sprinkle on the remaining cheese.

Bake in the oven for 20 mins until golden

<u>Support for migrant families</u> – use this calculator if you are a migrant family, or if you have no recourse to public funds

You may be able to get benefits paid early if you're already feeling the squeeze - this is known as 'a short-term benefit advance' - you will need to contact the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) office that's dealing with your claim.







#### Check you've received all the government's cost of living payments

The government's <u>cost of living payment</u> is available for those receiving certain benefits or tax credits. You don't need to apply for these – if you're eligible the money should go straight into your account.

If you think you're due a payment, but haven't received one – report a missing payment to the government here.

**Be aware of scams!** If you receive any emails, texts or phone calls asking you to fill in an application form or asking for your bank details to receive a cost of living payment, **do not talk to them or send a reply**.
