
### What is Boom Reader?

We are asking all parents and carers to support your child by listening to them read each night and encouraging them to log when they read for pleasure.


All Year 7 parents will have received log in details to set up a reading diary app with step by step instructions via email.




## **The Winsford Junction**

### Attendance matters

September 2023 Edition

Dear Parent/Carer.

At The Winsford Academy, we believe that good attendance and punctuality are important in helping students achieve the best that they can be. We expect high levels of attendance and punctuality from all our students. Regular attendance promotes positive social development, develops self-discipline, and improves student progress. There is a clear link between attendance and academic progress, as a school we expect all students to aim to achieve at least 97% attendance. Students with no absence are twice as likely to achieve 5 or more GCSEs at grades 5-9 including English and Mathematics.

We know that days off school soon add up, missing lessons makes it hard to catch up and students must work harder when they come back. We are therefore, asking you to support us by keeping your child's absences to a minimum during term time.

A brief outline of the school policy on attendance and absence appears below, with full policy and attendance details available on our school website.

### **Attendance**

If your child is absent, you must **notify the school on each, and every day of absence. This can be by** phone, (01606) 592300 or via email at <u>attendance@winsfordacademy.org.uk</u>. If you need to discuss your child's absence or have any concerns about their attendance, please contact school and speak to the attendance team.

### **Punctuality**

School begins at 8.43am and children are expected to be <u>in school</u> for registration by 8.45am. The school gates will be locked at 8.45am. Students arriving after this time will be given a late mark. Students arriving <u>into</u> school after 9.15 am will be coded as U. This is recorded as an unauthorised absence.

### Absence due to Illness

Any medical absence of more than 7 days (14 sessions) per academic year will need to be supported with medical evidence. This does not have to be a doctor's note but can take the form of either a dated GP/Nurse appointment card, a compliment slip signed and dated by the GP/nurse, a prescription or proof of prescribed medication relating to the current illness. If no medical evidence is received, then the absence will be coded as unauthorised (O). If a pupil accumulates 10 or more 'O' sessions during a termly period, the school may apply to the Local Authority for a Penalty Notice to be issued to each parent/carer. The Penalty is £60 per parent/carer per child if paid within 21 days, rising to £120 if paid within 28 days. Non-payment of the Penalty Notice may result in prosecution in the Magistrates court.

### Unauthorised absences: Fixed Penalty Notice (FPN)

Parents/carers should be aware that The Winsford Academy may contact the Local Authority if a student has 10 or more unauthorised absences in any one term, with a view to issuing a Fixed Penalty Notice. The Penalty Notice is issued individually to each parent/carer who fails to ensure their child's regular attendance at school. The Penalty is £60 per parent/carer per child if paid within 21 days rising to £120 if paid within 28 days. Non-payment of the Fixed Penalty Notice may result in prosecution in the Magistrates Court.

### Exceptional Leave of Absence

The headteacher cannot authorise any leave of absence during term time for a family holiday. Leave of absence for other reasons can be requested but will only be authorised in **exceptional circumstances** and at the discretion of the head teacher. If leave is taken without prior consent, the school the school may apply to the Local Authority for a Penalty Notice to be issued to each parent/carer. The Penalty is £60 per parent/carer per child if paid within 21 days, rising to £120 if paid within 28 days. Non-payment of the Penalty Notice may result in prosecution in the Magistrates court.
