Fundraising for St Luke's Cheshire Hospice

Harley Key took part in the 3 peak challenge with neighbours & family on the 11th August 2023 to raise money for St Luke's Hospice.

The challenge which they successfully completed in 24hours, including driving between mountains, involved the climbing of Ben Nevis / Beinn Nibheis (1,345 m or 4,413 ft), the highest mountain in Scotland, Scafell Pike (978 m or 3,209 ft), the highest mountain in England and Snowdon / Yr Wyddfa (1,085 m or 3,560 ft), the highest mountain in Wales. The total distance they walked is estimated at 26 miles with a total ascent of 9,800 feet (3,000 m).



Cambodia Trip

We started the expedition off by getting the bus down to Heathrow to meet the other schools from Poole and Portsmouth before boarding our 12 hour flight to Singapore Airport, celebrated as the 'best airport in the world'. Here we were able to view the butterfly garden before the second leg of our journey to Phnom Penh. We arrived at midday and stayed in a hostel for two nights. We spent the next two days in the city visiting S21 prison and the killing fields; a very emotional visit where we learned about Pol Pot and the Khmer Rouge; a truly horrific period in Cambodia's history and were humbled to meet with the three remaining survivors. We then got to experience a true Cambodian market.

The next day we were up early to travel to our first camp, Beng Pae where we stayed in traditional long houses. Up-on arrival we went to the monastery to receive a water blessing from the monks to keep us safe. Project work here entailed digging wells at two homes so the family would have access to clean water, an amenity we really take for granted in the UK. We spent our project days split between digging the wells, mixing concrete to make floor tiles and cement rings for the wells. We also spent a day at the school teaching the children and helping them with their English pronunciation.

From here we went to Sihanouk and stayed over before boarding the boat to Koh Rong, a stunning island to complete the PADI open water diving course. Both students achieved their PADI open water qualification after 3 days of diving. Whilst there we got to know the dive shop managers, Dennis and his family as well as the dive shop's resident monkey.

We then travelled on to Siem Reap to visit Angkor Wat for sunrise, the largest religious monument in the world, also considered the '8th wonder of the world'. We visited Angkor Wat, Bayon Temple and the famous Tomb raider temple and another traditional market before leaving the next day for camp Beng MeaLea.

This was our final camp. We made water pots by mixing clay with our feet and then sticking it to a timber mould, laid a playground tile floor, made a chicken coop and vegetable garden for a local family and spent time in the school teaching the children. Evenings consisted of playing cards and our students teaching group dance routines to Beyonce songs!

We headed back to Phnom Penh for one more night in the hostel before flying home! This trip was the adventure of a lifetime gave us the opportunity to really make a difference. It has changed our perspective on what is important in life and has helped us develop new skills and qualities, including resilience and independence. It was a life changing summer for all involved!




